MULTI-BRAND REMOTE CONTROLS Programming Instructions for Allegro MBC4030/MBC4035 and Zenith MBC4430/MBC4435

INTRODUCTION

This multi-brand remote control operates the common features of most, but not all, models and brands of IR (infrared) controlled video and audio equipment.

The remote may provide functions that are not available on your equipment, for example, menu operations. Some functions of your particular equipment may not be controlled by this remote. In such cases, use the original remote control for your equipment.

PROGRAMMING YOUR REMOTE (Also see Quick Program Guide on page 2)

If you are using Zenith products, the remote is programmed for the most commonly used codes. For other brands, or if your remote fails to control your Zenith products, you will have to program the remote.

Follow these steps for each product you are using:

- 1. Locate the three-digit codes for your brand (such as Zenith) and type of equipment (such as VCR) in the code table provided on page 4.
- 2. Press and hold PRG key with a small blunt object until the red light turns on (about three seconds). See page 3.
- 3. Press TV, VCR, CABLE, AUX, to select the product you want your remote to control. (AUX+1, AUX+2 and AUX+3 modes are also available, see Special Features.) Use CABLE or AUX, to program your remote for a second TV or VCR. Use AUX, to program your remote for a video disc player or audio equipment.
- 4. Enter the three-digit code for your equipment, then press ENTER.

 The red light should flash once, then turn off to indicate that the code was accepted. If the red light stays on, repeat steps 3 and 4 or try using a different code.
- To test your remote for proper operation, press POWER — the equipment should turn on.

To erase all code programming and return to the factory preset codes, key in code 911 when programming the remote.

NOTES:

- If no key on your remote is pressed within 60 seconds, you will have to start again.
- You may cancel programming at any time by pressing PRG.

AUTO FIND OPTION (Additional Programming Method)

If you have tried all the codes listed for your brand and type of product in the code table on page 4 first, and none of those codes operate your equipment, you can use Auto Find to search for the code you need.

Follow these steps for each product you want to program:

- Turn the product ON and point the remote toward it.
- Press and hold PRG with a small blunt object until the LED (red light) turns on, about three seconds.
- 3. Press the mode key on the remote for the product you want to control:

TV, VCR, CABLE, AUX,+1,2,3.

- 4. Enter "0-0-0", then press ENTER within two seconds. When the red light flashes three times and remains lit, Auto Find is active.
- 5. Press and hold **POWER**, then release it, repeating this action about once a second until the equipment turns OFF. (May require up to 300 presses.)
- 6. Press ENTER immediately to save the code. The red light will flash to indicate code has been stored. If your remote fails to operate the functions you use most often, you can

re-enter Auto Find and search for a better code.

NOTES:

- The red light should go OFF when you press POWER and back ON when you release it. If the red light stays on as you press POWER, Auto Find has tried all available codes. If you finish Auto Find and the product you want to control has not turned off, your remote cannot control that product.
- Pressing PRG at any time during the use of Auto Find will cancel Auto Find, and you will have to start again.

SPECIAL FEATURES (Additional Programming Options)

AUX+1, AUX+2 and AUX+3 Capability

2784-01-C

Your remote can control up to seven electronic components. If you have programmed the remote for four components using the TV, VCR, CABLE and AUX keys, you can program it for up to three additional components (AUX+1, AUX+2, AUX+3). Instead of Step 3 in the Programming Your Remote instructions above, press and HOLD down the AUX key and either the 1, 2 or 3 key at the same time, continue with the other steps in Programming. Once programmed, press and HOLD down the AUX key and 1, 2 or 3 at the same, to access the additional AUX+1, 2 or 3 mode.

Cable/Converter Volume/Mute Override (Code 399)

You may use your remote to control cable/converter volume and muting if available on your equipment. First program your remote with the brand code for your cable device using the CABLE or AUX key. Then repeat the programming steps, again using the CA-BLE or AUX key, but enter code "3-9-9" instead of a brand code.

To restore TV volume/mute to the **CABLE** or **AUX** mode, simply re-program the brand code for your cable device into that mode.

Amplifier Volume/Mute Override (Code 499)

You may use your remote to override your TV, VCR or video disk player's volume functions with your amplifier's volume and muting. First, program your remote with the brand code for the equipment for which you want amplifier volume override, using the mode key for that product: TV, VCR, CA-BLE, AUX, AUX+1, AUX+2 or AUX+3. Then, enter the brand code for your amplifier. Finally, repeat the programming steps, using the mode key for the equipment you wish to control (TV, VCR, CABLE or AUX), but enter code "4-9-9" instead of a brand code:

To restore normal volume and muting control, simply reprogram the brand code into the mode that is to be restored.

NOTE: CD and tape players will automatically select amplifier volume and mute.

Special Flashback Code 799

Provides for a direct channel entry flashback feature to mode/equipment not having this feature. Press desired mode key. Hold down **PRG** until the red light turns on (three seconds). Key-in code "7-9-9," then press **ENTER**. Use the numbered keys and **ENTER** (if necessary) to select channels. Select at least two channels using the direct channel entry method to activate the Special Flashback feature.

Once programmed, if you choose at least two channels using the numbered keys and press FLASHBACK, the remote will return to previous channel selected for viewing, (Last Channel Recall).


NOTES: Special Flashback does not work for numbers over 99 on equipment that has a 100+ key. To erase Special Flashback, reprogram the brand code into the mode that is to be restored. When using Special Flashback 799, keep pointing remote at equipment until channel changes.

OPERATIONS

To operate your equipment, select proper mode by pressing TV, VCR, CABLE, AUX, (AUX+1, AUX+2 or AUX+3) on

the remote. Now press the function you need. For example, press CHAN (Up Arrow) to change channels.

Some keys might have different names,

for example, Flashback may be called Recall or Enter may be called Display. These differences depend on the brand and model of your equipment.
